**Oklahoma Historical Society
Minutes of the Quarterly Board Meeting**
Wednesday, October 25, 2017

Call to Order

The regular quarterly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Oklahoma Historical Society was called to order by the president, Jack Baker, at 1:30 p.m., on Wednesday, October 25, 2017, in the Dr. LeRoy H. Fischer Boardroom, 800 Nazih Zuhdi Drive, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Pledge of Allegiance

Roll Call

Presentation of Service Pin

A service pin was presented to Dr. Bob Blackburn in recognition of forty years of service to the State of Oklahoma.

Echoes of History

Dr. Blackburn read from the minutes of a meeting held in 1968 where it was decided that the Oklahoma Memorial Association, then a committee of the OHS, would split to become its own organization. The association had plans to create a new building for display. The funding never materialized for the new building but they did utilize a donation of the Hefner Mansion. This split helped the OHS as it allowed a refocusing of the mission of the OHS.

Approval of Minutes from July 26, 2017, Meeting

Lewis Stiles moved to approve the minutes of the July 26, 2017, meeting. Seconded by Barbara Thompson, the motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

Shirley Nero reported that the OHS has \$2,242,937.61 in cash at the State Treasurer's Office. The OHS has \$200,403.05 invested in a Salomon Smith Barney account. This was originally a \$150,000 investment. The OHS has \$145,803.64 invested at Federated with an original investment of \$150,000. However, there are drawdowns of \$750 per month from that account. The OHS has \$2,361,151 invested in the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Endowment Fund. The total cash and invested funds of the OHS amount to \$4,950,295.30

Executive Director's Report

Review of budget projections and expenditures from the first quarter (July 1 to September 30, 2017). Terry Howard noted that spending in personnel was seeing savings due to unfilled positions and voluntary buy-outs done in the past fiscal year. Mr. Howard also noted that the sales tax is up \$11,473 for the first quarter of the year.

Update on Legislative Special Session and possible scenarios for making additional budget cuts. Dr. Blackburn speculated that, while there was gridlock in the legislature, he believed an agreement would be made soon. He stated that since the OHS does not yet know what will happen with appropriations, the agency is being very cautious with funds and keeping positions unfilled. If there are further cuts the plan is to divide those cuts evenly between the Oklahoma History Center and the Museums and Sites Division.

Update on fundraising efforts and results. Dr. Blackburn explained that with the continuation of budget cuts over the past few years, the need for earned revenue and fundraising is more important than ever. Preceding this meeting, Dr. Blackburn had asked a few divisions to create summaries of the efforts that they have made to increase revenue through earned income, grants, and fundraising. Larry O'Dell in Development reviewed the OHS fundraising totals for FY17, which included donations in the amount of \$1,122,779, donations to the endowment fund amounting to \$165,510, and membership dues amounting to \$283,531. Mr. O'Dell also noted other projects such as the annual giving campaign, grant submissions and tracking, membership strategies, and the first fundraising gala that took place in October. Dan Provo spoke regarding programs, exhibits, and actions that the History Center has taken to increase revenue. Mr. Provo discussed the successful *Art of Speed* car exhibit that was up for six weeks that saw a 31 percent increase in attendance. Additionally Mr. Provo discussed educational programs that have brought in funds, a new book project that is estimated to bring in \$25,000 in revenue, and grants that were received allowing for the upcoming *Welcome Home: Oklahomans and the War in Vietnam* exhibit. Chad Williams discussed the strides that the Research Division has made in earned revenue. One example is the digital archives department that has multiple digitization projects going with outside organizations that bring in revenue amounting to \$14,200 for just this quarter. Kathy Dickson discussed trends for the museums and sites at the OHS in terms of revenue generation. She noted that museums such as the Pioneer Woman Museum are currently covering all operating costs through donations and earned revenue. She also touted the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum and Cherokee Strip Regional Heritage Center for their ability to raise funds and operate self-sufficiently. Ms. Dickson stated that the Museums and Sites Division is reaching out to non-OHS operated museums, tribal entities, and organizations to help them develop exhibits to create a stream of revenue. Jeff Moore noted that while he is still in early stages for revenue generating efforts and fundraising, he is working to create a 501(c)(3) support group for OKPOP. Tad Jones updated the board regarding the efforts of the Will Rogers Memorial Foundation and an upcoming vision project for the Will Rogers Memorial Museums. Mr. Jones noted that this past summer a number of

children's programs were held and in response to that a donation was given by an individual in the amount of \$25,000 to continue supporting similar programs.

Update on collections activity. Jeff Briley gave an update on collections for the museum noting that this quarter the History Center has received nineteen collections with 352 artifacts. Mr. Briley also shared with the board that for twenty-seven years as a curator, he has been on the lookout for a pair of Blucher boots for the collection that were made in Fairfax, Oklahoma. Just recently Marilyn Barton asked him to look through her late husband's items. Daryl Barton was an award-winning news photographer and had been a friend to both Mr. Briley and the OHS. In looking through his items Mr. Briley came across the nearly new Blucher boots that now sit in the OHS collections. JA Pryse of the digital archives department discussed the digitization of archival collections with 109,000 items scanned or digitized this quarter. Kathy Dickson shared with the board that the OHS has received a donation of a portrait of Thomas Edmondson Wilson, a settler at Fort Gibson. Following assessment it has been deemed to be a George Catlin painting. Jeff Moore discussed collections at OKPOP, noting that work is moving forward with the Leon Russell and Bob Wills Collections through digitization efforts by Steve Ripley.

Consideration of a New Policy Regarding Formal Photography Sessions on OHS Historical Properties

Kathy Dickson noted that there had been issues of professional photographers and videographers utilizing OHS properties for commercial projects without permission. This new policy would require prior approval and a licensing fee of \$250 for commercial projects and outlines general photography guidelines.

Kenny Sivard moved to approve the photography policy. Seconded by Dan Lawrence, the motion carried unanimously.

Consideration of a New Policy Regarding the Display of Confederate Flags on OHS Historical Properties

Kenny Sivard moved to approve the proposed policy regarding the display of the Confederate flag on OHS historical properties, with the striking of the language stating that there was no documented evidence of the battle flag being carried in Indian Territory, as documented evidence has since been found. Seconded by Karen Keith, the motion carried unanimously.

Consideration of Converting the Cherokee Strip Museum in Perry to Affiliate Status

Kathy Dickson stated that the current director at the Cherokee Strip Museum will soon be taking over at the Pioneer Woman Museum in Ponca City. Moving the museum to affiliate status would allow for the OHS to have more flexibility and operate on a contract basis.

Deena Fisher moved to approve the Cherokee Strip Museum becoming an OHS affiliate. Seconded by Barbara Thompson, the motion carried unanimously.

Consideration of President Baker's Appointment of Three OHS Board Members to the Will Rogers Memorial Foundation

President Baker noted that the Will Rogers Memorial Foundation recently changed its bylaws and will add three members of the Oklahoma Historical Society board to their board. President Baker asked to appoint Karen Keith, John Cary, and Jack Baker.

Jim Waldo moved to approve the appointments made by President Baker. Seconded by Deena Fisher, the motion carried unanimously.
