Muriel Wright Award

The Oklahoma Historical Society annually offers the Muriel Wright Award for the outstanding article published in *The Chronicles of Oklahoma*, the official journal of the Society. The award carries a prize of \$300 and a wood and bronze plaque, and both are given to the recipient at the annual meeting of the Society in April of each year. H. Bailey Carroll Award
