She was a leader in the field of education and public selfare in three states in which she lived—Trans, Louisiana, and Odlahoma—establishing many wonderful and practical projects. It is difficult to imagine how one person could have brought to fruitten so much for the good of humanity, aspecially the home and the child. Her energies were unless, and her boundless enthusiasm awakened the interest of others to assist in bur love of helping and doing for others. Service was truly her life and though her dreams were often hard tasks they were overcome by het deep faith in God.

This was the first public school savings in the South (1914). The Browne's moved to New Orleans in 1916 where Mrs. Browne
