## MINUTES OF THE QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

## July 29, 1965

The regular quarterly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Oklahovan Mistorical Society was convened by President George E. Shirk in the Board of Directors Room at 10:00 a.m. on July 20, 1886.
