# MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

#### April 24, 1982

The Annual Meeting of the Ohlehoma Historical Society was called to order at \$2.00 a.m. on the morning of Thurnbury, April 24, 1989 in the auditorium of the Ohlehoma Historical Society Huilding, Predicting over the meeting was President of the Society, George H. Bliris, who introduced the Reversed J. S. Srivan, Reversed Strice then gave the Invocation.

President Shirk introduced Mr. Stanton L. Young, who gave a blogtaphkal sketch of Rascon Dunjee, footder of the "Black Dispatch", ploneer Negro uswepaper, showing the great efforts of this dedicated leader throughout his lifetime for the betterment of his proofs.
